GAP/ Needs Assessment Discussion, - Group with AMH Advisory Council Member

- Connie Tanner and Lisa Wong are looking at the crossover for adult and child data.

- They will be looking at AMH system case opens, where MH 911 calls come from, crisis response calls, looking into clinics throughout the county, student surveys, potentially electronic health records, satisfaction surveys throughout the county.
- Public Health is mandated to do a community needs assessment every 3-5 years. The last was done around 2019 and they match that with the community improvement plan.
- Community services and public health will pull it all together to create a map of where we are at from different point of views.
- Ideas of where to survey the community; A Family survey would be useful, pastor care/faith, parental support from school age students, students in school, ECCFE and WIC Clinics for birth to 5
- Public health does have some funding to support calming spaces and trainings on the school level.
- The developing brain institute also does a survey also if we want to look at what questions they ask.
