Heath Data Profiles, Community Partnership Assessments (CPA): Lisa Wong & Rebecca Leighton

- *Lisa Wong presented on how the information will be collected. Last CHA was conducted in 2019. 9 or 10 different avenues of collection for Health Data Profiles. Review of financial status for Washington County. Large gap in a median household income base on race. Females on the student mental health and wellbeing survey is significantly higher for depression. Washington County and the state level are right on par. Landfall continues to be at higher risk for needs. Community engagement team then continues to find ways to connect with the community. Data is being currently collected. Next step is to inform CHIP. Legislation requires this to be done every 5 years. Washington County does it every 3 years. We will be sending out surveys to LAC members to fill out.*
